**11 Orders to the Sentry**

1. To take charge of this post and all government property in view.
2. To walk my post in a military manner, keeping always on the alert, and observing everything that takes place within sight or hearing.
3. To report all violations of orders I am instructed to enforce.
4. To repeat all calls from posts more distant from the guard house or quarterdeck than my own.
5. To quit my post only when properly relieved.
6. To receive, obey, and pass on to the sentry who relieves me all orders from the Commanding Officer, Command Duty Officer, Officer of the Deck, and Officers and Petty Officers of the Watch only.
7. To talk to no one except in the line of duty.
8. To give the alarm in case of fire or disorder.
9. To call the Officer of the Deck in any case not covered by instructions.
10. To salute all officers and colors and standards not cased.
11. To be especially watchful at night and during the time for challenging, to challenge all persons on or near my post, and to allow no one to pass without proper authority.

**Proper response by a Cadet:**

**“Sir/Ma’am, the 5<sup>th</sup> Order to the Sentry is: Quit my post only when properly relieved!”**

**Other Important Information for UPI**

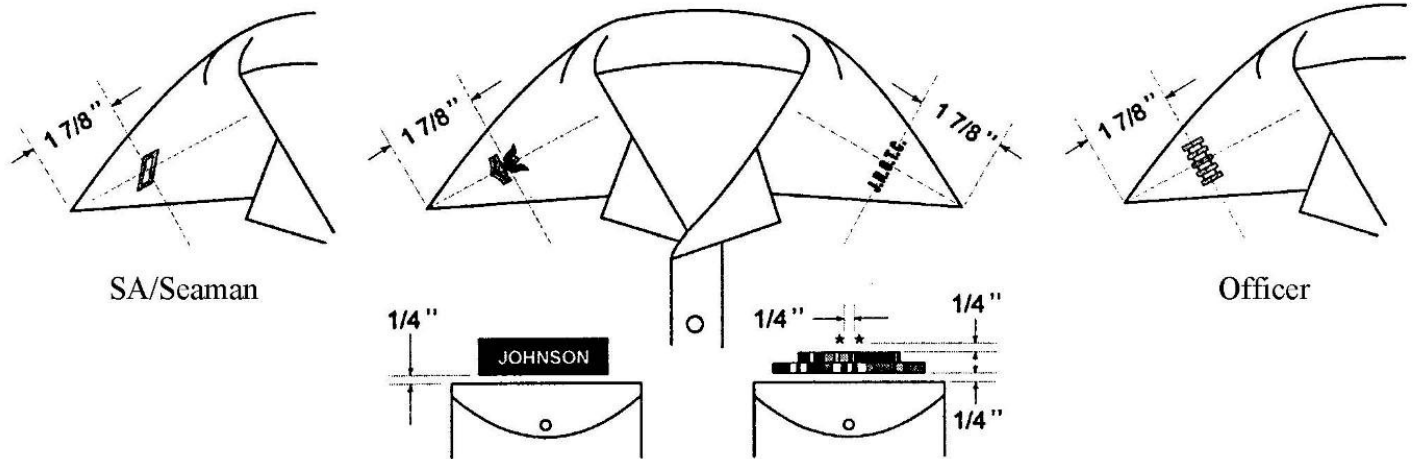
1. Navy Birthday: 13 Oct 1775
2. USMC Birthday: 10 Nov 1775
3. Front of the Ship is the: Bow
4. Rear of the ship is the: Stern

6. Port is left, Starboard is right
7. When heading to the rear of the ship, you are headed AFT

**Male Regulations:**

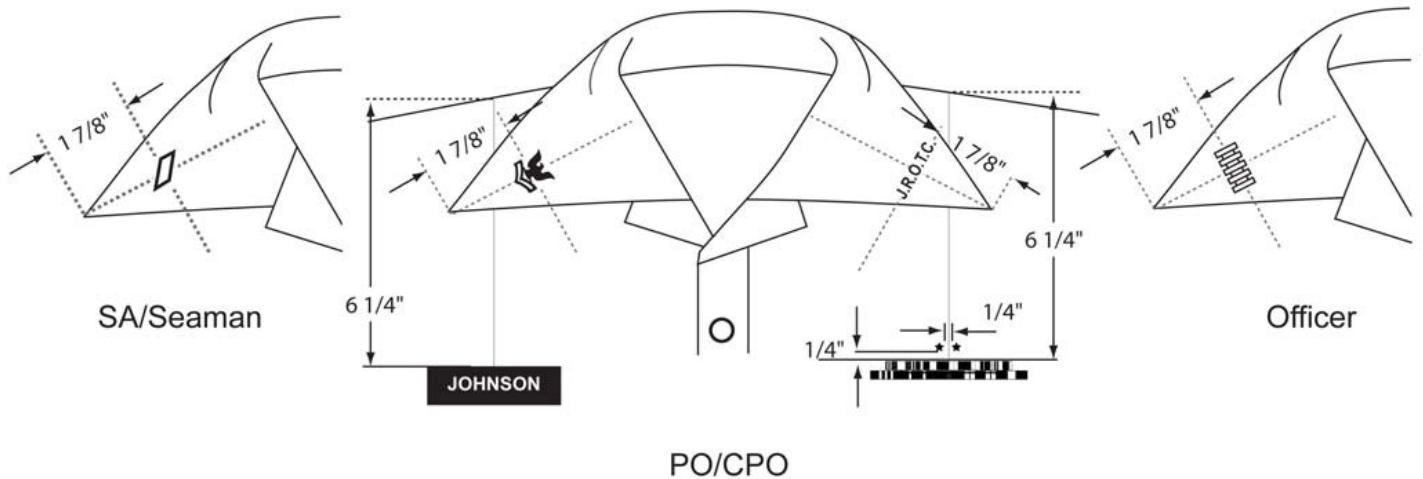
- Rank Device: 1 & 7/8th inch centered on the right lapel
- JBAR: 1 & 7/8th inch centered on the left lapel
- Fouled Anchor: 2 inches from the fore crease and 1 & 1/2 inches from the bottom edge
- Cover Rank Device (CPO and Above): Same as Fouled Anchor regulation
- NJROTC Patch: One inch below the left shoulder seam, centered midway between the front and rear of the shirt sleeve.
- Name Tag: 1/4 inch above the right breast pocket, centered.
- Ribbons: 1/4 inch above the left breast pocket, centered.
- Service Stars: 1/4 inch above the ribbons.

**Female Regulations:**

- Rank Device: 1 & 7/8th inch centered on the right lapel
- JBAR: 1 & 7/8th inch centered on the left lapel
- Fouled Anchor: 2 inches from the fore crease and 1 & 1/2 inches from the bottom edge
- Cover Rank Device (CPO and Above): Same as Fouled Anchor regulation
- NJROTC Patch: One inch below the left shoulder seam, centered midway between the front and rear of the shirt sleeve.
- Name Tag: 6 & 1/4 inch below the right shoulder seam.
- Ribbons: 6 & 1/4 inch below the left shoulder seam.
- Service Stars: 1/4 inch above the ribbons.
